



2020 Greater MetroWest Jewish Overnight Camp Scholarship Guidelines

The Greater MetroWest Jewish Overnight Camp Scholarship program seeks to enable campers from families with significant financial need who may not otherwise have attended Jewish overnight camp to be able to do so.

Participating Camps - Scholarships are available for an array of camps across the denominational spectrum that serve the largest number of Greater MetroWest NJ campers, including the following for 2020:

<u>Camp Havaya, Camp Kinder Ring, Camp Moshava, Camp Ramah in the Berkshires, Camp Ramah in the Poconos, Camp Young Judaea Sprout Lake, Camp Zeke, Eden Village Camp, NJY Camps, Tel Yehudah, URJ 6 Points Sci-Tech Academy, URJ Camp Harlam, URJ Crane Lake Camp, URJ Eisner Camp</u>

Camper/Family Eligibility:

- Camper must be under age 16 as of June 1, 2020
- Camp session must be 12 consecutive days or more
- Up to 3 years of support per child
- Maximum of \$5,000 Federation scholarship support per family per summer
- Preference will be given to children for whom Jewish camp is their first intensive Jewish experience

Family Eligibility:

- Family must live in Greater MetroWest New Jersey Federation area (Essex, Morris, Sussex, Union and parts of Northern Somerset Counties) or be affiliated with a synagogue or school in Greater MetroWest
- Income evaluation will be based on multiple factors, including number of children and type of school attended
- Families with children in public school with income above \$125,000 (or families with children in Jewish Day School with income minus the family's cost of Day School tuition above \$125,000) should contact the Federation Scholarship Coordinator before submitting an application; these applicants may be considered in the case of extenuating circumstances (such as excessive health care costs or other needs)
- Family will be required to submit the top pages of their most recent IRS Form 1040, as well as Schedule A and Schedule D if applicable
- Family must contribute a portion of the camp tuition

Other Important Information:

- Camper must be registered and apply for scholarship through the participating camp prior to receiving Federation scholarship
- Family must reach out to the camp, extended family and temple/synagogue for potential funding before applying for the Federation scholarship
- Scholarships will be paid directly to the camp in the name of the child(ren)
- Children not attending day school may also be eligible for a One Happy Camper Grant

Volunteer Service Requirement:

Each camper and their family are expected to participate in at least two volunteer opportunities sponsored by Federation or other local Jewish organizations by May 1, 2021. The priority volunteer recommendation is to be involved with Tour de Summer Camps NJ bike ride, Federation's key fundraising event for Jewish camp, on October 18, 2020. The Jewish Federation of Greater MetroWest will provide information about meaningful volunteer opportunities and also welcomes the family's suggestions.

Deadlines:

Funds are limited – please apply as early as possible. There will be up to five review cycles for 2020. Applications will only be considered when complete (including tax documents) and submitted by the due dates below. Applications with exception requests to the standard criteria will most likely be placed on a waitlist to be considered in review cycles 3 and 4 (if funding is available).
