# 7 STEPS

## To Successful Sleepaway Camp Planning How to choose THE RIGHT CAMP for your child

1

### Think about how to get sleepaway camp into the summer mix.

There are so many benefits to sleepaway camp! If your child is reluctant to go away, many camps offer intro programs and shorter-stay options as a low-barrier way to start.

2

### Take time to do research.

There are so many options. Identify the features you think will best suit your child and you – such as more or less freedom of choice, traditional vs. specialty focus, geography of campers, size and cost.

3

### Involve your child so they have a vested interest.

Pre-screen camps first, and then review options together. Browse websites and videos, attend open houses – even follow the camps on Facebook and Instagram.

4

### Meet the camp director.

This will help ensure you're aligned with the camp's philosophy. If you can't meet at camp, schedule a home visit or a video call, or attend an open house. Speak with camp families and have your child ask questions.

5

### Visit camps whenever possible.

Ideally visit during the summer. Next best is a spring or fall open house or program at camp. Be sure to contact the camp and schedule your visit. Zoom calls and virtual tours are helpful too.

6

### Don't let cost be a barrier.

There's a camp for every child and every budget. Camps may offer early-bird discounts and subsidies when parents work at camp. Many camps, and Federation, offer need-based scholarships.

7

### Evolve as you go through the process.

It's a learning experience, so be open to revising your priorities and criteria. Trust your gut feeling – if it feels right and like “your camp” – then it probably is!
